Public Realm Principles

Principle i: Pedestrian-Forward Mobility District



A distinctive public realm that appeals to pedestrians, who can move seamlessly and safely throughout the entire Penn Station area, with high-quality public spaces to enjoy and activate. Principle ii: Unified Systems Management
