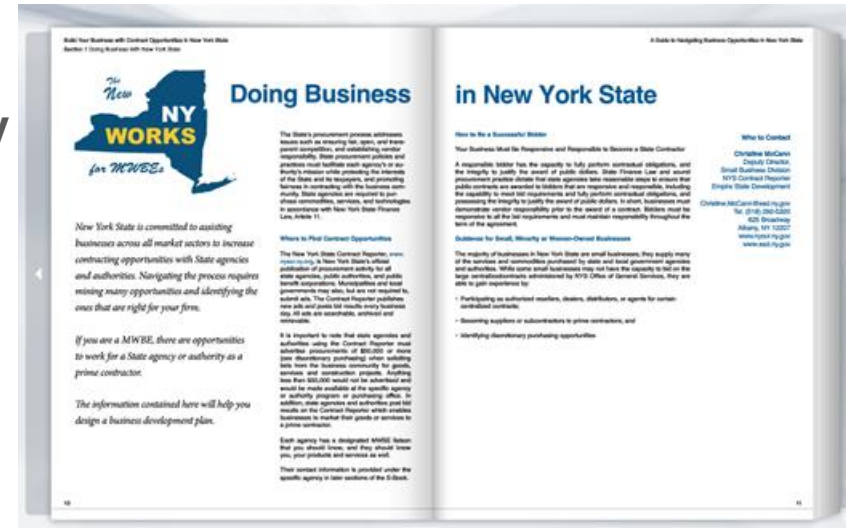
What is this e-book?

DASNY

DASNY (Dormitory Authority of the State of New York) is New York State's finance and construction authority. Created in 1944 by the New York State Legislature to finance and construct dormitories for state teachers' colleges, DASNY's mission has grown significantly over the last 70 years. Today, DASNY provides financing and construction management services to a myriad of public and private not-for-profit clients, while expanding opportunities for Small, Minority and Women Owned Business Enterprises and embracing sustainability initiatives.

What We Do

DASNY finances and builds facilities for public and private higher education, health care providers, school districts, certain public agencies and not-for-profit institutions. DASNY issues tax-exempt bonds on behalf of its clients to finance the construction, rehabilitation, or equipping of facilities. In addition, DASNY has a Tax-Exempt Equipment Leasing Program (TELP) that clients can access to finance various equipment, including upgraded or replacement telecommunication systems, computer information management systems, CT scanners, MRIs, electronic medical records systems and energy efficiency systems. DASNY clients include a number of diverse organizations such as New York University; North Shore-Long Island Jewish Health Care, Inc.; Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center; Roswell Park Cancer Institute; New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation; Columbia University; Cornell University; Albany Public Library;; psychiatric centers operated by the State Office of Mental Health, the City and State Universities of New York and the New York State Unified Court System, among others.
